Patrick Tay LLB '95 LLM '99 is a lawyer by training. After starting his career in the Singapore Police Force, he has been working in the trade union movement since 2002. He is currently Assistant Secretary-General in the NTUC, leading efforts to help all Singaporean workers. He is also the co-chair of the NTUC-SNEF PME Taskforce where he champions the interests of PMEs (professionals, managers and executives) so that they continue to have a level playing field to earn better wages, enjoy better welfare and better work prospects, ultimately protecting the Singaporean Core. Since 2011, he has been involved in the review of most major labour legislation in Singapore such as the Employment Act, Employment Claims Act, the Industrial Relations Act, and the recent Workplace Fairness Legislation. He has also advised and assisted numerous unions and union members on complex legal, employment, and industrial relations matters, including representing them in the Industrial Arbitration Court.
